LETTER FROM MONSIGNOR KEN

As you know by now (at least you should!), this year we are observing our 75th Anniversary. Our celebration will formally begin next month with our annual Carnival, July 11-16. However, our anniversary is more than just an historic occasion. It is a time for spiritual renewal and revival.

To that end we have scheduled a very special evening and it is my hope that many will attend. We are fortunate to have Immaculee Ilibagiza coming to speak on Friday, July 21. With so much anger, division and violence in our world, she, after having survived the Rwandan Holocaust, has a message of reconciliation and hope, which is exactly what we need. Please join us for what promises to be an unforgettable evening as we continue to celebrate our anniversary.

Our formal celebrations will take place on Sunday, July 23, 1:30pm in St. Mary of the Pines with Bishop O'Connell. Following the Mass there will be a procession to the statue of Mary located near the Parish Center where we will have a short prayer in honor of our Patron. Then, there will be a free festival! It is my fondest hope that our Church will be filled to overflowing that day. Even if you normally attend another Mass, please come for this special Mass. You will be able to receive Communion twice if you attend two Masses that day. (One is sufficient for the Sunday obligation.)

On Sunday, July 30, 12noon in St. Mary's, there will be a second celebration with our County Vicar. I hope that this Mass will be packed as we celebrate at the site of our original Church. This Mass also will conclude with a procession to the statue of Mary, which faces the Adoration Chapel, followed by a reception in Monsignor Reinbold Hall. Please join us for both.

My excitement for these events leaps off this page to touch your spirit! My prayer is that this special anniversary will serve to ignite or re-ignite our Faith and devotion. In addition, I am excited for these events because I love our parish and am so proud of who we are and what we do. Certainly, there are many parishes across our country celebrating anniversaries and, no doubt, they, too, are beautiful and proud communities. Still, I think there are some things about St. Mary's that are unique.

Today I want to mention just one--your generosity. You know from the Tithing Report how much you give each week to support our parish and our ministries. As extraordinary as that is, that is only part of your sacrificial giving. I couldn't even begin to calculate how many hours of volunteering and praying happen each and every day across our parish. One probably would have to invent a new method of record keeping just to estimate it! However, recently I was reminded again of how generous you are. You welcomed Father Vincent from our twin parish with open arms. It was so heartwarming to see and feel our beautiful parish embrace our Ugandan brother. We published in our bulletin how much you poured out your hearts in real dollars.

In the meantime, St. Mary's has an obligation, as does every parish in our Diocese, to welcome missionaries as part of the annual Missionary Cooperation Plan. By an unfortunate convergence of circumstances, our missionaries this year, the Sister of St. Joseph of Cluny, were scheduled only two weeks after Father Vincent. I was

concerned about over burdening our parish and I was worried for how well the Sisters would do. St. Mary's did it again! Even though the Sisters were a bit difficult to understand, you knew they were about God's work and why they were here. I was absolutely astounded when I heard how much you gave to their work after already emptying your pockets for Fr. Vincent. I only can say, "Thank you" and how proud I am to be the pastor of such a beautiful parish!

There are so many dark clouds in our world. The Church is called to be a bright light shining hope upon all. As Church, St. Mary's is a beacon of generosity, love and faith and that is worth celebrating!

"I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the Gospel from the first day until now" (Philippians 1:3-5).

KNOW YOUR SAINTS

St. William of Vercelli (1085-1142), June 25.

Born at Vercelli, Italy, of noble parents, he was orphaned when an infant, was raised by relatives, and when fourteen went on a pilgrimage to Compostela. He was at Melfi in 1106 and then spent two years as a hermit on Monte Solicoli. After abandoning a pilgrimage to Jerusalem when attacked by robbers, he became a hermit on Monte Virgiliano (Vergine) and attracted so many disciples that he organized them into a community that by 1119 became known as the Hermits of Monte Vergine, and he built a monastery. When objections arose against the strictness of his rule, he and his friend St. John of Matera with five followers founded a community on Monte Laceno in Apulia. When fire destroyed their hermitages, William moved to Monte Cognato in the Basilicata. Again he left and founded monasteries at Conza, Guglietto and Salerno, opposite the palace where he became adviser to King Roger I of Naples. William died at Guglietto on June 25.

REALITY CHECK- BASIC TRUTH

Every Catholic should know that the Bible, the Word of God, is divided into the Old Testament and the New Testament. However, since God's Revelation is fulfilled in the New, there are those who erroneously dismiss the Old Testament as out dated or irrelevant. In fact, recently in a discussion over the moral teachings of the Church, someone remarked, "That's in the Old Testament."

This is not a new heresy. In 144, a man named Marcion founded a heretical sect that held that the God of the Jews, that is the God of the Old Testament, was not the God of the Christians, the Father of Jesus, the God of the New Testament. Not only did Marcion dismiss the Old Testament, but went so far as to propose that there were two gods, the God of the New Testament, and a lesser god, not really God, of the New Testament. He claimed that Christ's death had released man from the tyranny of the God of the Old Testament. He rejected all the texts of the Old Testament and most of the New, keeping only ten epistles of St. Paul and parts of St. Luke. This dualism was eventually absorbed by another heresy, Manichaeism. Because it adopted a strong ecclesiastical organization, parallel to that of the Catholic Church, it was a dangerous heresy. We can see similar heresies in some forms of Christianity even today. Marcionism was condemned and its influence died out in the West by the third century, lingering in the East until the seventh.

As members of our Twin Parish Ministry we wish to thank all of our parishioners who helped support Saint Mary’s Twinning Ministry.

Our Water Only Wednesday campaign was remarkable with our young parishioners taking part in helping to provide clean water for Uganda.

- * Our CCD students contributed \$1700 toward a water tank nearby Holy Trinity
 - * The students at All Saints School added another \$620 to that effort as well.
 - * Students at Monsignor Donovan Catholic HS have committed to sponsoring a secondary student’s education.
 - * Many Parishioners joined and donated their Lenten Sacrifice to our Water Only Wednesday Program.
 - * Our Parishioners generously supported the Ugandan Bead and Craft Sales.
 - * Many parishioners attended the International Night Dinner and welcomed Father Vincent.
- The proceeds from the night went to our Secondary School Building Fund.
- * Some Parishioners have signed up for the Feed A Family Program and are feeding families.. They are really saving lives for \$25 a month.
 - * Our second collections for Father Vincent totaled...\$17,857!

Your continuing generosity speaks volumes by providing for these poor and indigent members of Holy Trinity. Their needs are so great and continuous that it is often difficult for us to conceptualize their living conditions.

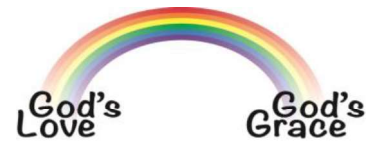
