LETTER FROM MONSIGNOR KEN

Firstly, I would like to offer an urgent plea to parishioners to consider becoming an Adorer. In the twenty years since we have been blessed to have Perpetual Adoration, we have the most hours that are not filled. It saddens me greatly when I see those open hours each week in the bulletin. Remember one option is to adopt an hour as a team, either a family, neighbors or a ministry. If you adopt that hour with a group, you will not have to go each week. Further, we are in need of those willing to serve as substitutes. Prayerfully consider becoming an adorer today. Thank you.

One of the questions on the Prenuptial Inquiry for couples preparing for marriage in the Church is: "When did you become formally engaged?" I use that question as an opportunity to find out the story of how they got engaged. As many stories as I have heard, each one is unique and special. I challenge the couple that they should remember that moment, especially in the future when the routine of marriage can tempt them to forget that initial spark.

I hope that each of you as such a "go to" memory, some special and happy moment to recall in more challenging times. It could be an engagement, a family memory, a special trip, a story from work, a proud achievement in sports, an award, or a first pet. Most of life is routine, whether at home, school, or work. Because of that we can also be tempted to look at life as boring, forgetting, as the movie title says, "It's a Wonderful Life!" That's where those special memories can be of help. They remind us of the specialness of life and the importance of gratitude.

That is exactly what our nation does every Fourth of July. Every year we recall those courageous and even miraculous events that founded this great nation. With a daily barrage of depressing news and a divided body politic, it is very easy to forget the magic that is America and the dream that started it all. The tragedy is not that life is difficult or that we face challenging times. The tragedy is that too many forget the magic and the dream. For at least one day, we stand in the shadows of those great men and women who began it all with much less than we have today.

"And, for the support of this declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other, our lives, our fortunes and our sacred honor."

REALITY CHECK- BASIC TRUTH

Here are some interesting facts about the religious affiliation of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. There were 56 signers. Their breakdown by religious affiliation is such: 32 Episcopalian; 13 Congregationalist; 12 Presbyterian; 2 Quaker; 2 Unitarian or Universalist; 1 Catholic (Charles Carroll of Maryland).

"The signers of the Declaration of Independence were a profoundly intelligent, religious and ethically-minded group. Four of the signers of the Declaration of Independence were current or former full-time preachers, and many more were the sons of clergymen. Other professions held by signers include lawyers, merchants, doctors and educators. These individuals, too, were for the most part active churchgoers and many contributed significantly to their churches both with contributions as well as their service as lay leaders. The signers were members of religious denominations at a rate that was significantly higher than average for the American Colonies during the late 1700's."
