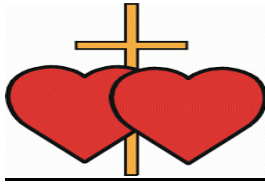

## **LETTER FROM MONSIGNOR KEN**

The actual date for our 75th anniversary was this past week, July 7. The history of our parish is one that is certainly characterized by growth. From a small beginning with a handful of Catholics celebrating Mass in a home we have come a long way! When I arrived in 1992 to become pastor, St. Mary's was still a relatively small parish. The new St. Mary's was only dedicated a few years earlier and we also held Mass in the old parish center (remember!). The religious education office was in a small room in the rectory (now my office). I was the only priest and I lived upstairs. The now Charlie Kiger Room was my living room and the business office was my bedroom. One of the easiest ways for me to gauge the growth is by traffic. I clearly remember in those early years being able to pull out to West Bay Avenue, look both ways and go. Now, as every parishioner knows, you have to look and wait, and wait, and wait, and then finally be able to pull out of the parking lot.

I don't remember the exact year now, but the moratorium on new building was lifted and our parish exploded. With new senior communities and many individual homes, our numbers quadrupled. We are now the largest parish in the Diocese by numbers with the biggest program of religious formation. At a time when churches were either being closed or consolidated, we built St. Mary of the Pines (within a year of the construction of the new St. Pius X and St. Theresa). At a time when Catholic Schools were closing we opened a new one, All Saints Regional Catholic School, with the support of four other parishes (St. Pius, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, St. Francis, and St. Theresa) and the Diocese. As if all that wasn't enough, we built a Perpetual Adoration Chapel and the new Parish Center. We were growing!

One of our blessings is having so many attend Mass each and every morning. I have often remarked that we have more people at daily Mass than some Catholic Churches have on a Sunday in parts of our country. We are fortunate to be in an area that is experiencing life and growth, unlike many places that are struggling with decline. It is a tribute to the vibrancy of our towns and the strength of the faith of our parishioners.

While our growth and size may be an accident of circumstances, it is also true that at the center of our parish there are many active, loving Catholics. I believe that this is what makes St. Mary's special and one of the reasons I am both proud and happy to be pastor. Even though we have continued to grow (there are still new developments going up as we speak), our focus has always been on prayer and devotion. While we always hope and pray that more and more of our parishioners will become more active in the practice of our faith, many are, especially our wonderful seniors! The fact that there are so many at Mass, so many praying, so many devotions, is what keeps us strong.

Our size of itself presents many challenges. However, despite that, I believe that another one of our strengths is that we have been able to keep the feeling of a smaller parish. Friendliness, hospitality and welcome are important qualities of our parishioners. I believe, that for the most part, new parishioners sense that spirit of community. It is that charism of warmth that also make us special.

Anniversaries are important occasions. They are times of remembering, recalling special moments and beautiful

memories. They are times to give thanks to God. They are times to celebrate. Of course, St. Mary's is not a perfect parish and there are many other great parishes in our Diocese and in our Church. Still, I think we're something else and we have much to celebrate. Happy Anniversary St. Mary's!
