LETTER FROM MONSIGNOR KEN

Thank you to everyone for your prayers as we traveled to the holy sites of Fatima and Lourdes and home again. We had a safe and essentially problem free trip, but more importantly an absolutely wonderful pilgrimage.

There is so much to share, more than can be put into words for this column, so some things you will not hear. I won't write about the bathrooms (anyone who has been to Europe knows) because some of the group still have nightmares. I can't share how I got into trouble at the Cathedral in Compostela for again asking to take a group to the restrooms resulting in me being politely told that it's not allowed to keep using them! I don't have time to share the miracle of the rest stops when two busloads of people crowded the counters with only two servers and still managed to get fed and back on the bus on schedule. I also can't speak about the experience of ordering food without us speaking Spanish and the servers not speaking English, and still having a good meal. I won't tell you that there is nothing in Europe that is nearby--I wish I had a Fitbit to know how far we actually walked--and I don't have time to recall the mad dash in Munich to leave the plane on the tarmac to get on a shuttle to go to the terminal to climb steps, led by a guide, to walk and walk and walk and go through security and walk and walk and walk to get to the connecting flight. I am not going to write about any of that. Instead, I want to share just a little of the many graces received on our journey.

We began in Fatima and ended in Lourdes with rain in both places, which did not dampen our spirits or limit the wonder of those most holy sites. I have been privileged to visit Fatima before, but this time was even more special because of the centennial of the apparitions. I kept thinking, "I'm really here. I am really here!" While celebrating Mass there, the word that kept coming to me was "hope." The message of Fatima is certainly one of warning, but I had an unshakable obsession with a conviction of Hope. ***With so many overwhelming challenges facing our world, God's love for us is so great that He has given His mother to us, over and over again, to invite us to change. Hope comes from hearing that message and responding to God's call to a different, a better way.*** At night we joined in the rosary in the Chapel of the Apparition, followed by a Eucharistic procession. That is always moving, however this procession was particularly moving. As the Blessed Sacrament was being brought back to the chapel, all the pilgrims divided into two lines. As the Monstrance passed between us I imagined a scene where people lined the streets as Jesus passed. It was a powerful moment.

The morning we left I rushed back to the shrine for one last visit and to leave petitions at the Apparition Chapel. In the early morning with few people around I had a feeling of warmth and peace, grateful to be able again to visit this sacred shrine. Compostela continues to be one of the great pilgrim destinations in the world. While we arrived by bus, I was captivated at the thought of countless people who have walked the roads of Europe to arrive at the shrine of St. James, the first apostle to be martyred. (A thought came to me of a way to bring the spirit of the journey of the Camino to St. Mary's. I will share that with you in the weeks ahead.) While there, one night I had a very vivid dream. In it a person was sharing how they were going to another church because the preacher had a "gift." ***In the dream I responded, "Every priest has a gift. The gift to celebrate Mass and offer the Eucharist. That is THE gift."*** I awoke still contemplating that powerful thought, surely an inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

Providentially, it was during Mass in a smaller church in Compostela that this thought continued. The small church had

a very ornate sanctuary. I realized that at every Mass we are on the border between Heaven and earth. ***The elaborate display of angels and art made me think of Mass as a doorway to the Liturgy in Heaven before the throne of God.***

In Madrid we had Mass in a chapel of the Cathedral where the king and queen were married. The guide described the church as "ugly," but we found it very beautiful. The following day was a great feast of Mary and we witnessed school children coming with flowers to place outside the Cathedral. The Church was built on that site because it was there that a statue of the Blessed Mother was discovered. Her image had been hidden from the invading Moslems, and when the area was recaptured by Christians it was found unharmed! I prayed for peace among religions and an end to terrorism as I looked upon that holy image.

Our spiritual journey ended in Lourdes. I can only say that, for me, there is no place like Lourdes. The night we arrived it was raining and cold. After dinner some of us walked to the grotto. It is so peaceful standing there, so much so that I didn't want to leave. ***I say it again, "There's no place like Lourdes."*** After praying, we walked over to the place where candles are lit for special intentions. As we did so, we were surprised by a candle procession of children coming from both sides behind us to the grotto. They carried a statue of Mary and a lone cantor sang prayerfully in French as they prepared for a service. The following day we again saw large groups of youth throughout the grounds of the shrine, their joyful sounds dispelling the clouds in the sky.

The baths are being remodeled for next year so they were closed. However, we had the opportunity to enter an area near them for a simple ceremony involving washing our faces and drinking the waters of Lourdes. It was not like the myriad times of the past that I had washed my face and drank countless glasses of water, this was different. It was beautiful. On that last night we celebrated Mass in honor of St. Bernadette in the crypt chapel. I shared during my homily that too often our world casts aside those considered of little significance or of no value. The mission of the Church from the beginning is to stand with and for those so neglected. Consider St. Bernadette herself. She was a young girl who could not read or write, yet the Blessed Mother spoke to her. Today that spot in Lourdes is one of the most visited and influential shrines in the world. All that came, by the Grace of God, to one who was cast aside by the world.

Each and every one on this pilgrimage was moved by the experience and grateful for many blessings. While it was special to visit these most holy sites, the same God that was worshipped there is also worshipped here. Even those unable to make such a trip can still receive incredible graces. Be aware of the profound love God has for you and the miracle of His presence that you can experience right here at home. St. Mary's and St. Mary of the Pines are not unlike Fatima and Lourdes in that here we, too, can adore God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit and honor Mary, our Mother and Mother of the Church. Here, too, the presence of the sacred is alive. Here, too, the King is present and waiting for us. Here, too, we can become holy.

"When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he said, 'Truly, the Lord is in this place and I did not know it!' He was afraid and said: 'How awesome this place is! This is nothing else but the house of God, the gateway to heaven!'" (Genesis 28:16-17).

KNOW YOUR SAINTS

St. Barlaam (4th Century), November 19.

Martyred at Antioch, untrustworthy legend has him an illiterate peasant who was imprisoned and tortured for his faith. When his judge could not force him to sacrifice to the gods, he held Barlaam's hand over red-hot coals and sprinkled hot incense over the hand, reasoning the intense heat would cause Barlaam to shake off the hot incense, thus giving the impression he was sacrificing to the gods. But Barlaam held his hand unflinchingly until it was consumed.

REALITY CHECK- BASIC TRUTH

We continue our look at the attributes of God. (Source: Handbook for Christian Apologetics by Peter Kreeft and Ronald K. Tacelli).

7. God is Intelligent. God is the Creator and Sustainer of all things. He is, for example, the Creator and Sustainer of all physical and chemical elements and all living organisms. Now every one of these things has an intelligible structure, and fits within a system of intelligible structure—a system in which things act and react with each other in certain specific ways determined by the system. This intelligible correlation of part with part (of which our intelligence grasps the tiniest measure) is something established by God. An intelligible correlation of part with part is the kind of thing we normally refer to as a “plan,” as an “act of intelligence.” So it is reasonable to affirm that all the vast intelligibility, which the world is given by its Creator, is the work of intelligence and, therefore, that the Creator is intelligent.

8. God is Omniscient and Omnipotent. To say that God is omniscient and omnipotent means that there can be no real barriers to God's knowing or acting. Apart from Himself, God has created everything there is to be known and sustains it in being. So is it conceivable that there is something He could not know or not have power over? It is impossible to think of something as thwarting God's will, unless God Himself allows the thwarting—as in the human free choice to sin. But that is a circumstance that requires omnipotence, and there is not an argument against it.

9. God is good. God is the source of all that we recognize as good. Now let us go a step further. God is the source of all being. Therefore God cannot be evil in any way, for whether an evil is moral or physical, it is properly understood in terms of what should be there but is not. A thing is good of its kind (and that qualification is important) if it succeeds in being that kind of thing to the fullest. It is bad if it fails. Now there can be no question of failure on the part of the Creator; God is to the fullest. And insofar as goodness is one with perfect being, God is the Perfect Good.
