LETTER FROM MONSIGNOR KEN

At our last Beefsteak Comedy Night in September, one of the comedians, who is a Catholic, talked about making a "Life Confession." While he was making jokes about it during his performance, when I talked with him afterward he shared that it was, indeed, not only something that he had actually done, but had found it to be very powerful. The idea behind a "life confession" is to have a more thorough and far reaching examination of one's life before God than is usually done. Along the same lines, there are many forms of "Examination of Conscience" that we can use not only in preparation for going to Confession but also for a daily self-reflection.

Just as we can do a cursory or perfunctory examination of conscience that only touches the surface, we can do a deeper exam with gratitude. I am sure that everyone took time on Thanksgiving to thank God for His many blessings. How much time did you take? Did you really make a thorough inventory of your blessings? Each of us has hurts, disappointments, regrets or bad experiences. We are very much aware of them and even spend much time in reviewing them. On this Thanksgiving Weekend I challenge you to make a "Life Confession of Blessings." This means to take time, even over several days, to review your life so that you become aware of all the graces you have received. To assist you, here is an outline for such an examination.

People: Just think of how many people you have encountered in your life, from family and friends, even to those you may have met only once. In that collection, there have been some incredible and wonderful people. When was the last time you thought about them, whether it was a special grandparent, a teacher, a priest or nun, a neighbor, or a Good Samaritan? It will take some time to recall and thank God for the many good people that have touched you along the way.

Places: How many places have you been in your lifetime, from homes, to schools, to vacation spots or places of work? In those places you have had many experiences, lessons learned, and encountered all kinds of personalities. Imagine in your mind a map with a marking for each of the places in which you have lived, visited or just stopped by. Remember all the beautiful and amazing sights you have seen.

Material blessings: In this country we are blessed with so much. We have an abundance of food, clothes and shelter, not to mention electricity, cars, conveniences, heat and air-conditioning. When was the last time you made a complete inventory of all the comforts you have been given in life? Certainly there were times in your life when you did not have these, but those memories make these blessings even greater. Beyond the necessities, we have been fortunate enough to enjoy many "extras" in life, many of them gifts given to us.

Experiences: Life is a series of experiences from encounters with people, to lessons learned, moments of growth, beauty and inspiration. Think of your graduation, your wedding, the birth of a child, a family gathering, a special concert or sporting event. Those experiences happened in our homes and families, school, places of work, times of travel, restaurants, leisure, etc. Just think of all the memorable and delicious meals that you have shared with precious company.

Faith: Sadly not everyone has faith. It is a blessing to have been raised as a Catholic and to know about God, His love for you, His Son Jesus, the Holy Spirit, the Church, and the Sacraments. That faith has given you many graces. Think of those many special moments in your life connected with faith, like First Communion, Confirmation, being at Mass, a time of prayer or a Retreat. ***How many times have you experienced the presence of God?*** It is not just the saints that have mystical experiences and profound inspirations and moments of prayer. ***Many people become lukewarm in their faith because they fail to notice all their encounters with God and missed the many times He has revealed His presence.***

The day of Thanksgiving has passed but not the time to give thanks. That time is always. We will soon enter the season of Advent and begin to look forward to the Solemnity of Christmas. Take advantage at this wonderful time of the year to make a Life Inventory of Blessings. Take time to do this, giving it more than just a few minutes, and I promise that your experience will be profound and even life changing!

"The loving deeds of the Lord I will recall, the glorious acts of the Lord, because of all the Lord has done for us, the immense goodness to the house of Israel, which He has granted according to His mercy and His many loving deeds" (Isaiah 63:7).

KNOW YOUR SAINTS

St. Sylvester Gozzolini (1177-1267), November 26.

Born of a noble family of Osimo, Italy, he studied law at Bologna and Padua but then switched to the study of theology and Scripture. He was ordained and became a canon at Osimo until he berated his bishop for the dissolute life he was leading; Sylvester resigned his canonry in 1227, when he was fifty, and became a hermit near Osimo and then at Grotta Fucile. Directed by a vision of St. Benedict, he organized the disciples he had attracted into a monastery at Monte Fano near Fabriano in 1231, thus founding the Silvestrine Benedictines, known as the blue Benedictines from the color of their habit. The congregation was approved by Pope Innocent IV in 1247, and Sylvester ruled it for thirty-six years until his death at Fabiano, by which time eleven monasteries were under his rule. He was equivalently canonized in 1598 by Pope Clement VIII.

LETTER FROM FATHER VINCENT

"I bring you all the love from Holy Trinity Catholic Parish, Ziroobwe. All the brothers and sisters here send you greetings and love. We are always united as we pray for all of you at Mass and in our daily prayers.

Dear brothers and sisters, thank you so much for feeding many people in Holy Trinity. Thank you for buying us food! Thank you so much for feeding MY PEOPLE. I really feel very happy when I see my people smiling. We need food to survive, but I feel so happy when I see my people have something to eat for sure.

There are many things we have to thank you for dear brothers and sisters. Allow me also on behalf of all parishioners of Holy Trinity and on my own behalf to thank you for the big dream of our secondary school. The school is named, 'ST. MARY'S HIGH SCHOOL, ZIROOBWE!'" (We will share more of his long letter over the next few weeks.)

REALITY CHECK- BASIC TRUTH

Today we conclude our series on the attributes of God examining the question, "Is God a He?" (Source: *Handbook for Christian Apologetics* by Peter Kreeft and Ronald K. Tacelli).

"The hottest controversy today about God concerns the traditional exclusive use of the pronoun he. Nearly all Christians admit (1) God is not literally male, since He has no biological body, and (2) women are not essentially inferior to men. Those are red herrings.

"There are, however, two reasons for defending the exclusive use of masculine pronouns and imagery for God. One issue is whether we have the authority to change names of God used by Christ, the Bible and the Church. The traditional defense of masculine imagery for God rests on the premise that the Bible is divine revelation, not culturally relative, negotiable and changeable. As C. S. Lewis put it, 'Christians believe God Himself has told us how to speak of Him.'

"The other reason for calling God "He" is historical. Except for Judaism, all other known ancient religions had goddesses as well as gods. The Jewish revelation was distinctive in its exclusively masculine pronoun because it was distinctive in its theology of the divine transcendence. That seems to be the main point of the masculine imagery.

"Surely there is an inherent connection between these two radically distinctive features of the three biblical or Abrahamic religions (Judaism, Christianity and Islam): Their unique view of a transcendent God creating nature out of nothing and their refusal to call God "she" despite the fact that Scripture ascribes to Him feminine attributes like compassionate nursing (Isaiah 49:15), motherly comfort (Isaiah 66:13) and carrying an infant (Isaiah 46:3). The masculine pronoun safeguards (1) the transcendence of God against the illusion that nature is born from God as a mother rather than created and (2) the grace of God against an illusion that we can somehow save ourselves—two illusions ubiquitous and inevitable in the history of religion."

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Advent is often described as a season of joyful anticipation, desire, longing and expectancy. Saint Faustina beautifully explains this longing in her diary. For her it was a longing to make room for Christ in her heart. We can make room for him through reading Scripture, spending time in prayer, confession, attending daily Mass and spending regular time in the Eucharistic Adoration. (Advent: A How to Guide, Divine Mercy Marians) Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration at St. Mary's takes place in the chapel on church grounds in Barnegat and all are invited to visit.
