PROGRESS REPORT #9 FAITH IN OUR FUTURE

To bring you up to date regarding the Faith in Our Future Implementation Team, let's review briefly where we are. Cohort #25 was asked to have two (2) Hispanic Centers, one in Northern Ocean County and one in Southern Ocean County. St. Barnabas in Bayville was chosen last spring to be the northern site. The cohort met to determine the southern site. After meeting as a cohort, a sub-committee was chosen to get specific and two (2) members of the Latino Community were asked to join in our discussion.

Many points were brought to the surface but the main point and perhaps the decisive point was that just over 75% of the Latino population in Southern Ocean County live in the Barnegat/Manahawkin area. For the convenience of going to Mass and to receive the Sacraments, St. Mary's/St. Mary's of the Pines was selected as the Southern Ocean County Hispanic Center site.

As was requested by the Bishop's Commission we notified by report and signatures of Cohort members present that our selection of a site was completed on October 23, 2017. The cohort will continue to work to make both St. Barnabas and St. Mary's to be a welcoming and warm Center for their community. It should be noted and recognized by everyone however, while we welcome our Latino Brothers and Sisters to our church, it is imperative that we not allow this to become a parish within a parish. Both communities, Latino and Anglo must worship, work and play together as one.

More information will be forthcoming as to how to accomplish this. In the meantime we ask everyone to learn to "open your mind" and pray for the success of this endeavor.

LETTER FROM FATHER NESTOR

The following took place during my visit to Fatima, Portugal, and to Spain, stops on my recent pilgrimage.

When I first entered the new Basilica of Our Lady of Fatima in the afternoon of September 12, 2017, immediately I became totally absorbed by this Church. I sat down just a few steps from the entrance and at this distance I had a panoramic view of the Tabernacle, the Altar and the image of Our Lady. I took several shots of each using my phone before I knelt to do homage and acknowledge the Lord's presence; then, I moved forward to the front pews. Her image was at the right side so that the pilgrim's first attention and honor is for her Son. Spending a couple of minutes, I began my greeting to her in a whisper and said, "You know why I am here." I took another picture of her and then got up to leave.

On my way out, I looked at the last picture I had taken of her on my phone and noticed the color of Our Lady's dress was blue. I turned back to look again at the image I just left and to my surprise, it was white! My hosts said that the difference in the color between the picture on my phone and the actual image might be due to the light. Or-- was Our Lady telling me something? Since arriving I had not stopped taking pictures of historical or religious places everywhere, including *here* in Fatima. **I had forgotten the purpose of my visit--was now a tourist, no longer a pilgrim!** I had been so fascinated by the beautiful places and good food. How easily evil had diverted my attention taking me away from the real purpose of my trip by using my senses. I thought of the invited guest in the Gospel who disappointed the King (Mt 22:1-5). I had spent only a couple of minutes with Our Lady whereas previously I had given most of my time, attention, and space collecting memories of my trip.

Feeling disappointed with the way I acted and embarrassed by my rudeness, I decided to stay for a while to spend time with our Blessed Mother. I walked back nearer to her and quietly prayed the rosary, like so many pilgrims. Again, the difference in the color of the picture on my phone which was blue and the actual image in front of me which was white was still on my mind. "Why was it blue in the picture when the image was actually white?" Then like a flash of lightning it occurred to me that blue is a symbol, the color for Peace. Our Lady had answered my prayers! Yes, that is the reason why I am here! In this place Mary gave us a message of Peace. WOW-- this was for me a bull's eye, a direct hit! She knew that in my heart I had many plans, many desires like a raging bull. We all know, however, that our hearts at times go in different directions and our plans and desires are conflicting and so we cannot integrate them into our life. The heart becomes confused like a raging bull! My voice told me, peace is the answer of Our Lady and it is time for me to calm down.

I placed my phone back into my pocket and spent a quiet hour in front of the white image. **In prayer, I realized that Our lady has never failed me, never abandoned me. She really knew why I was there and our silent meeting was enough for me to understand her message and for her to communicate her overwhelming love for me.** I understood that this was a visit of a son to his mother, a beautiful homecoming, a reconnecting experience.

The Vigil that evening and the following morning celebrations lasted five hours each, a gathering of two thousand or more priests and several thousand pilgrims filled the grounds of Fatima. It is a living testimony of the place, truly holy grounds. Pilgrims all over the world speaking different languages gathered here to celebrate the 100 Year Anniversary of Our Lady's Apparition to the three shepherd children.

A week later we entered the walled city of Salamanca, Spain. Our tour guide stopped the group at the corner of the first street. He pointed to the street name which was "Tentenecio" meaning "Stop, you fool!" The legend says that St. John of San Facundo stopped a raging bull which got loose on this spot by placing his hands on the animal's horns and saying, "Tente necio--stop you fool" and thereby saving a mother and child from the bull. I thought of what happened in Fatima and understood *tentenecio* was meant for me and roared with laughter. Indeed it reminded me of my spiritual enlightening. The guide told us that Salamanca is a city of learning where the famous University of Salamanca, founded by King Alfonso IX in 1218, is located. As we approached the University, the guide again pointed to a name on the wall. It was the name of an alumnus written with the letter "T" inside the letter "V" and the word "cor" passing through the "T" and "V." He explained that "T" stands for Triumph or Victory; "V" stands for Veritatis or Truth; "cor" is the human heart. Education is the triumph of truth the alumnus achieved in his heart. In the end, an educated person is a person of peace because within his/her heart truth has triumphed. It was likened to the enlightenment a Buddhist monk attains in meditation.

I agree with the guide's explanation of the meaning of the sign on the wall that it is a symbol of an alumnus victory, one who had completed and passed all the hard work of doctoral studies. In the past, this was called "discipline." I wonder if those with the highest degree of learning nowadays have this discipline? I wonder if leaders, civil and religious, seek and promote this? In our age of bloggers and various media outlets, the world is a slave to fake news and hate information. It is like a *raging bull!*

Peace is the message of the Lady in blue pictured in my cell phone. She appeared in Fatima both one hundred years ago and silently several weeks ago with the same message of PEACE. Peace will "tentenecio;" it will stop the *raging bull* in my heart.

KNOW YOUR SAINTS

St. Zachary and St. Elizabeth (1st Century), November 5.

They are the parents of St. John the Baptist. Zachary was a priest in the Temple in Jerusalem whose wife, Elizabeth, Mary's cousin, was beyond childbearing age. Once when he was serving the Lord in the Temple, he was told by an angel in a vision that they would have a son and should name him John. When he doubted this he was struck dumb. Elizabeth was visited by Mary, at which time Mary spoke the hymn of praise now known as the Magnificat, and after John's birth Zachary's speech was restored. This is all that is known of Elizabeth and Zachary and is found in the first chapter of Luke. An unverifiable tradition has Zachary murdered in the Temple when he refused to tell Herod where his son John was to be found.

REALITY CHECK- BASIC TRUTH

Recently we presented some incorrect understandings of God. Today we begin a series listing some of the attributes of God. (Source: Handbook of Christian Apologetics, by Peter Kreeft and Ronald K. Tacelli)

1. **God exists absolutely.** God is the source of being, or existence, for all things. Looking at the universe we see that in every creature there is a distinction between its essence and its existence; that there is a difference between what things are and the fact that they are." Unlike God, all things that exist are dependent for something outside of themselves to have being, to exist. God is the fullness of being. He alone exists of Himself and is not dependent on anything else.

2. **God is infinite.** God is without limited and thus cannot be limited by anything. He cannot be defined by space or time. As the fullness of being, God is without limit and is therefore infinite.

3. **God is one.** If God is Being and is without limit, there cannot be more than one God. If there were more than one, then each would not exist absolutely and each would be limited.

4. **God is spiritual.** God is not a material being. To have a body is to be subject to change or decay, neither of which is part of God.
