LETTER FROM MONSIGNOR KEN

Earlier this year, the Reverend Billy Graham, one of the most well-known evangelists and preachers, died. One of the most notable aspects of his ministry was his massive crusades. They always ended with an invitation for anyone present to come forward and make a commitment to Christ as their Savior. This is known as an “altar call” and has been practiced by other preachers and is not uncommon in many Protestant and Evangelical churches.

While you may be familiar with this practice and may have even witnessed it, this certainly is out of character for Catholics. Could you imagine coming to Mass and hearing the priest make an invitation to come forward to make a personal commitment to Christ?

You may be surprised to hear me say that, not only have I witnessed this as Mass, but that I have done it at every Mass I ever celebrated. In fact, every priest at every Mass has done it. I’m sure you are wondering how that could possibly be and that you have never heard it at any Mass you ever attended.

Let me ask you this instead. Have you ever heard this at Mass? -- “Behold the Lamb of God. Behold Him Who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb.” Of course you have. Let me now ask: What does that mean? What is on your mind when you hear those words? You might think of it as just a signal that now it’s time to come forward to receive Communion. No! It is SO much more. That is our Catholic altar call!

The problem is that too often we go up to receive Communion without much thought, just because it’s what we do. The Church teaches that before we even get in line there are certain requirements to receive Communion worthily and with effect. We must believe that it is the Body and Blood of Jesus. We must be in the state of Grace. That means that we are without serious sin, which is why regular Confession is a beautiful way to prepare for receiving Communion. We should also have made a commitment to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. When we go up to receive Communion we are literally accepting Jesus as our Savior because we are taking Him, not just into my body, but into my heart, into my mind and into my soul.

Someone who has been away from the Church, or has been weak in faith or even has no faith could be moved during Mass to experience a conversion of heart. However, Mass is not primarily a retreat or revival. The Eucharist is the culmination, or as the Church proclaims, “the source and summit” of our Faith. We go to Mass to praise, adore and thank God, and also to recommit ourselves to Him.

There are many other avenues and means to experience conversion, but these all point to the Mass. In our Catholic Faith there is a lot we do before Mass to prepare. That is why we go to Confession, fast before receiving and try to recollect ourselves to be properly disposed. Receiving Communion is not the same as an altar call, but thinking of it in that way can prevent us from taking that awesome opportunity and gift for granted.

Each time you come forward to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, come forward with your mind and heart open. Know what you are doing. Come forward to receive Jesus in the Eucharist as your Lord and Savior. As you return to your pew, take advantage of that time and pray – talk with the Lord. And, remember the prayer of St. Padre Pio after he received Communion: “Stay with me!”

“Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself” (1 Corinthians 11:27-29).

KNOW YOUR SAINTS

St. Charles Lwanga (d. 1886), June 3.

A master of pages at the court of King Mwanga of Uganda, he had succeeded Joseph Mkasa, a Catholic, whose censure of the King for his murder of a protestant minister and his homosexuality and corruption of the young pages had intensified Mwanga’s hatred of Catholics. Mwanga ordered Lwanga and fourteen of the pages who were Christians sent to Namugango. Three of them were murdered on the way; Lwanga and the others, with two soldiers, were burned to death. Among them were a thirteen-old Kizito, and Mbanga, a boy who was killed by his uncle, who was the chief executioner, before being thrown on the pyre. Some one hundred people died in the persecution; among those martyred were a young catechist, Denis Sebuggawo, speared to death by Mwanga himself; Andrew Kaggwa, a native chief, beheaded; Pontain Ngondwe, a soldier; and Mathias Kalemba,, a Membo judge, tortured to death. Also among those martyred in the same persecution were Matthias Murumba, an assistant judge to the provincial chief who was attracted to Christianity by Protestant missionaries and then was baptized a Catholic by Fr. Livinhac; also Andrew Kagwas, chief of Kigowa, who had been active in conversion work. In all, twenty-two martyrs were canonized in 1964 by Pope Paul VI as the Martyrs of Uganda.

REALITY CHECK/BASIC TRUTH

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. **The Church teaches, as it always has, that at the Consecration of Mass the bread and wine become the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.** That is the teaching but what do Catholics believe?

In 2008, in response to a CARA research survey, only 57% of Catholics agreed that Jesus Christ is really present in the bread and wine of the Eucharist. As sad as that is, this was even down from the response in 2001 when 63% of Catholics believed in the Real Presence. Conversely, in 2008, 43% of Catholics said they believed the bread and wine are only symbols of Jesus and that He is not really present.

There was a large difference in response to this question based on Mass attendance. Among those who attend Mass weekly or more often, 91% believed in the Real Presence. Of those who attend Mass less than weekly but at least once a month, only 65% believed and among those who only attend Mass a few times a year or less only 40% believed.

It is also interesting that there was a difference in response by region. 69% of those living in the South believed in the Real Presence, while only 48% of those living here in the Northeast believed.

Finally, among those who attended some college, respondents who were enrolled at a Catholic college or university are more likely than those who were not to believe that Christ is really present in the Eucharist (65% compared to 55%).
