LETTER FROM MONSIGNOR KEN

This week as our nation observes its independence we celebrate the dream that became a reality, enshrined in our founding documents and in the stories of the men and women that made it come true. The heart of that dream is the human longing for freedom and the laws that preserve it.

Many years have passed since that founding and we can wonder what has happened to that dream. Are we really free? I suggest that the other part of the American dream besides freedom, was faith. I believe the two must go together.

Part of the challenge that confronts us is a growing failure to understand the true nature of freedom. I see an emerging acceptance of a secular definition and a rejection of a religious one. If God and religion are cast aside, the myth is created that the more choices one has the more free one is. Many, as a consequence, define freedom as nothing more than having an abundance of choices and the removal of any influence that would limit one's own ability to make a choice. In this perspective, one could theoretically choose "X" one time and "Y" another even if they are mutually contradictory. In this view of freedom that does not matter because the most important thing is that one can make their own choice.

Even putting logic aside for the moment, we can ask ourselves what are the fruits of this philosophy? The assumption is that increased freedom in this sense automatically leads to greater happiness. All I can say is look around you! Listen to the news; read the headlines; ask around!

If we choose something false, we are not free. Look at addiction. Someone who is struggling this way makes multiple choices, but they are not free. Sadly, they are slaves. They are slaves of their addiction. Similarly, if someone makes a wrong choice, there are consequences. Infidelity can be seen through the prism of secular freedom as exercising choice. The reality is that a person is not free because harm has been done. These simple examples remind us that freedom is not just a matter of choosing.

Another way this false understanding of freedom enslaves us is by mindlessly multiplying choices. The truth is that when we make a choice we eliminate other possibilities. Until we choose we are not free. Keeping our options open means that we are never grounded, always searching. Think of someone who decides to move to "X" but is always thinking about "Y." They are not free because they have not really chosen. They will never be free until they either accept living in "X" or decide to move to "Y" and accept that.

St. Augustine is the classic example of the difference between these two understandings of freedom. He spent much of his life embracing the secular understanding of freedom. He was "free" in the fullest sense of that understanding, but he was never free. He was not happy, not at peace. He was restless. In that phase of his life he could serve as a poster person for the secular view of freedom. It was not until he made "the" choice that he was truly free. It was not until he became a Christian, or

as he said, embraced the God-man, Jesus. This freeing choice is enshrined in his famous quote: "You have made us for Yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You." (From the Confessions of St. Augustine)

Freedom is an incredible gift but merely the opportunity of choices is not true freedom. We are not free until we choose and choose the Truth!

"If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31b-32)

KNOW YOUR SAINTS

St. Shenute (d. c. 450), July 1.

Born at Shenalolet, Akhym, Egypt, he became a monk in 370 at the double monastery at Bair-al-Abiad near Atripe in the Thebaid and in 385 succeeded his uncle Bgol, who had founded the abbey as abbot. Shenute's rigorous austerities, severe rule, rigid discipline, and severe punishment for slight infractions attracted many to the monastery (at one time it is estimated that some two thousand monks and eighteen hundred nuns lived there). He accompanied St. Cyril of Alexandria to the Council of Ephesus in 431, where Shenute was active in his opposition to Nestorius. He was a leader in the development of monastic communal life and in time was regarded as archimandrite of all the surrounding monasteries. He wrote extensively in Coptic, mainly letters of spiritual direction and sermons, is believed to have died when he was 118, and may have died as late as 466. His named is also spelled Schenute, Shenoute, and Sinuthius.

REALITY CHECK/BASIC TRUTH

In the same Gallup survey from last week, they also researched the reasons people give for NOT attending church. The responses were divided into two groups, rational reasons and practical reasons. In the category of those who had intellectual reasons for not attending, this was the breakdown: Don't agree with organized religion/what they preach—24%; Don't believe in going to church—16%; Atheist/don't believe in God—10%; Church wants/asks for too much money—3%. The remaining responses fell into the category of practical reasons, and this is the breakdown: Don't have time/Don't get around to it—21%; don't have a church I connect with—9%; I'm lazy—6%; Poor health/disabled—2%; Family members are different religions—1%; other—5%; No reason in particular—6%; No opinion—3%.

YAMBA UGANDA

We met with Father Vincent at Mary Goss's house prior to his departure back to Uganda. Father Vincent wanted to express his heart warmed thanks to all parishioners here at St. Mary's. He insisted upon sharing a full accounting with numerous costs and numbers of all donations from June 1, 2016 to January 23, 2018.

Highlights of this review featured: the last phase of HS construction, construction of boys and girls toilets, purchase of numerous student desks, brick walls surrounding the dormitories, chain link fencing around the perimeter of the HS and the installation of a large septic system for the HS and student dormitories.

I asked what his priority would be for our latest collection of donations. He explained that a larger water tank (much larger than the usual water tanks installed in villages) would be needed and installed for the HS. Also completing an existing building which will provide a kitchen, dining room and sleeping quarters for the cooks and gatekeeper. (Cooks rise at 3:00am to start the fires to cook for student's breakfasts at 6:00am).

Father Vincent delineated numerous expenses during the course of preparing for the school opening: advertisements, posters, letter heads, vouchers etc. There is no TV, radio, or internet near the school for those living close to the school.

Father specified several impending needs and concerns as well:

- Lack of many library books,
- Lack of textbooks. 10 students are currently sharing the same textbook. (Textbooks are needed for every discipline; math, English the sciences etc.)
- Lack of laboratory supplies for the various science subjects. (currently they are using the bare minimum just to get certified temporarily. The science building is constructed but vacant)
- Needed items for the kitchen and dining rooms include tables, kettles, utensils, etc. for workers as well as the children.

Father emphasized "YAMBA HEART". This is a program where older students help tutor the younger students at the school with their studies and give back to the poor nearby. He concluded by stating he was reaching out to "the poorest children living nearest to the school". Many of whom cannot afford to pay tuition or even part of it. There are numerous children who want to attend St. Mary's HS but have NO money.

If you are interested in sponsoring one of these poor children please contact Mary Goss or any member of our ministry. Sponsorship, which provides education, food and clothing in addition to educational needs is the key to success.

After I reported this to our ministry members, it was suggested that we promote a "**Bucks for Books**" program at this year's carnival in addition to our on going "**Be a Hero...Feed a Family**" program as well.

Our Ministry's online gift store raised over \$900 during the past 3 months. You can sign up to feed a family of 4 for an entire week for a mere \$6 contribution or purchase a gift item, all of which is tax deductible. (st.marysugandaministry.com)

Monsignor Ken and I look forward to our trip to Holy Trinity this August. We will be your eyes and ears while visiting there. We hope to return with photographs, interviews and videos that we will be able to share with all of our parishioners upon our return. Our Ministry thanks you for your continuous support.
